## CMP RULES:

Metals are awarded to the highest scoring 10 percent of the non-Distinguished competitrors:

1) Highest one-sixth of top 10 percent = Gold metal or 10 points

2 Next highest two-sixth's of top 10 percent = Silver metal or eight points

3) Remaining three-sixth's of top 10 percent = Bronze metal or six points.

Therefore: Awards For Non-Distinguished Competitors:

[1 Award = 6 to 15 competitors, 2 Awards = 16 to 25, 3 Awards = 26 to 35 Competitors]
