Mandatory Safety Brief at 01:45 PM. Match Begins Promptly at 2:00PM

Where: Birchwood Recreation and Shooting Park, Chugiak, Alaska

Eligibility: Open to everyone, new shooters welcome! CMP membership is not required.

Safety: Ear and eye Protection will be worn on the designated firing range.

Safety Flags will be inserted in the pistol chamber while in the pistol box or case, and on the range, until commanded to remove the safety flag.

Pistols will be cased and uncased on the firing line. Pistols will always remain in the case until such time as authorized to uncase.

Cold Range: please clear and stow your CCW prior to match sign up.

Lead is bad, follow all hygiene and mitigation practices regarding lead exposure.

What:

- Match 1: Presidents 100
- Match 2: Service Pistol EIC Match
- Match 3: 22LR EIC Match
- Match 4: Military and Police Service Pistol.
- Match 5: Glock Pistol Match
- Match 6: Aggregate of Match 1,2,3,4,5
- Match 7: Unfired. Long Range Match. Scores, 20 shots Slow Fire from Presidents 100

Course of Fire:

- Presidents 100 Course. 40 rounds for record. 20 shots Slow Fire at 50 yards. 20 rounds timed and rapid Fire at 25 Yards
- Service Pistol EIC, 22LR EIC will fire a National Match Course. 30 rounds for record for each match. 10 shots slow fire at 50 yd. 20 shots timed & rapid fire at 25 yd.
- Military and Police Service Pistol. 5 Sighters, 40 rounds for record. 25 Yards B-8 Target only. Table 10 Below.
- Glock Pistol Match. 50 rounds for Record. Table 11 Below.

Targets: B-6, B-8, D-1 targets will be used, respectively.



Time Limits:

- **Slow Fire:** 10 rounds fired in 10 Minutes.
- **Timed Fire:** 5 rounds fired in 20 seconds, twice.
- **Rapid Fire:** 5 rounds fired in 10 seconds, twice.

Pistols:

- **Presidents 100:** Any Pistol, Any Sight. Centerfire or 22LR. Optical sights allowed.
- **EIC 22lr Pistol:** Any Pistol, Revolver or Semi auto, Iron sights, no optical sights, 22LR only, needs to hold 5 rounds.
- **Military and Police Service Pistol:** Iron sights, rack grade, 9mm-45 Cal.
- **Glock Pistol:** Stock or Unlimited. Any CF. Model 44 22LR. Out of class: Rack Grade Pistols, Iron Sights.

Approved Service Pistols: There is a big list of approved pistols! See [Microsoft Word - CMPApprovedServicePistols22.docx \(thecmp.org\)](#) and [CMP Pistol Program - Civilian Marksmanship Program \(thecmp.org\)](#) *Yes you can bring your Glock!* Semi auto, 5.4" maximum barrel length, iron sights, calibers 9mm, 38 Super, 40 SW, 10MM, 45ACP. Iron sights. No optical sights.

Rules: Current CMP Games Rules will govern the competition. See [CMP 2023 COMPETITION RULES ARE NOW ONLINE - Civilian Marksmanship Program \(thecmp.org\)](#)

Duties: Competitors will act as scorers and move down range to move, repair, or replace targets. Competitors are requested to assist with target set up and restow please.

Equipment: Competitors will supply target pasters, staples and staples, pens, safety flags, ear, and eye protection.

Scoring: Scoring overlays may be used. Scoring Plugs are not allowed.

Challenges: Should a competitor challenge a shot value, a range officer will provide a scoring plug; however, should the competitor continue to challenge the shot value, the competitor will place \$1.00 on the challenged target, replace with a fresh target and present the target in contention to appointed Jury Members for adjudication. . The competitor's challenge fee will be returned if their challenge is upheld.

Classification: Current CMP Classifications will be used. Competitors may fire in their classification, subject to Rule §3.11 2022 CMP PISTOL COMPETITION RULES. Unclassified competitors not holding a CMP Match Pistol Classification and not electing to compete on their current NRA Classification, will compete in the Unclassified Master Class.

Alibis: Alibis not allowed in the EIC Matches.



Entry Fees:

Match 1: \$20 for BRSP Members, \$25 for non BRSP Members for Match 1.

Match 2, Match 3, Match 4, Match 5 \$20 for BRSP Members, \$25 for non BRSP Members for **each EIC match**.

Combined Tournament Fee: Shoot Match 1-5 for \$60 BRSP Members, \$70 non BRSP Members

Pins: CMP Achievement Pins will be awarded at the match.

CMP MATCH RULES EXCERPTS



Firing Schools, Pistol Marksmanship 101 Classes, and in CMP Special EIC Pistol Matches.

7.2.3 As-Issued M1911 Pistol, Cal. .45 ACP

The pistol must be a U. S Armed Forces issue M1911 cal. .45 ACP pistol or a commercial pistol of the same general type and caliber. The pistol must comply with the following requirements.

- a) The pistol must be in as-issued or “factory stock” condition, with standard grips and non-adjustable sights and without specialized match conditioning or accurizing features;
- b) The pistol must generally conform to the weight and dimensional specifications of the standard-issue service pistol;
- c) Rebarreling with a barrel of the same type and length as the M1911 barrel is permitted;
- d) Only government-issue parts or government or commercial parts of the same general weight and dimensions may be used;
- e) The trigger pull must be at least 4 lbs. Trigger shoes are not permitted;
- f) Only 7-round magazines with no extensions or magazine bumpers may be used; and
- g) It is the intent of this rule that reasonable flexibility must be applied in determining if the pistol is an M1911-type pistol within the spirit and intent of this rule.

7.2.4 Military & Police Service Pistol

Pistols must be semi-auto pistols that are practical or suitable for issue as a military or police service pistols. The pistol must comply with the following requirements:

- a) Pistol calibers cannot be smaller than 9 mm or larger than .45 cal.;
- b) Barrels may not be more than five (5) inches in length;
- c) Pistols must have a single or striker action trigger pull of not less than 4.0 lbs. (Glock and Springfield Armory XD pistols with barrels no longer than five (5) inches are permitted);
- d) Pistols may not be match conditioned; and
- e) Pistols must be equipped with standard issue non-adjustable sights.

7.2.5 Glock Pistol Match Pistols

There are three pistol categories that are used in Glock Pistol Matches:

- a) **Glock Pistol Stock Class.** Glock pistols are considered “Stock” if all firearm components are or ever were available from Glock Inc. Additional permitted modifications to Stock Class Pistols are:

¹ The 25-yard pistol target (Rule 3.5.1 e), B-8) must be used for all stages.

² All stages of fire must begin from the ready position (with the arm(s) and pistol pointed down at a 45-degree angle).

³ For stages 1 and 4, competitors may elect to fire while using either two hands or one hand.

- a) **Target Mounting.** Five separate targets may be mounted on a single target board (one sighter target and four record targets) or standard 25-yard pistol targets may be placed in frames one target at a time with target changing and scoring periods between each stage. If five separate targets are mounted, the 5-minute sighting stage and the 5-minute record stage can be combined into one 10-minute stage fired on two separate targets.
- b) **Firing Position.** All firing is done from the standing position with no artificial support for any part of the body. The hand or hands to be used to grip the pistol will change according to the course of fire (see Table 9). All stages begin with the pistol loaded and the pistol pointed downrange and lowered to the bench with the arms raised at no more than a 45-degree angle (ready position). If a competitor does not assume or fails to start from a 45-degree start position or lifts the pistol before the targets

Glock Pistol Match Pistols

Glock pistols are considered “Stock” if all firearm components are or ever were available from Glock Inc. Additional permitted modifications to Stock Class Pistols are:

- Hogue-grip type sleeves, A-grip panels, skateboard tape or other grip-enhancing materials that do not materially alter the function of the stock pistol.
- Slide and barrel stripping and/or refinishing.
- Pearce Grip Inc. grip extenders on G26, G27, G29, G30, G33, G36 and G42 magazines; and
- Post front sight and U or square-notch rear sights, provided no slide modifications are made to accommodate the sights. Fiber optic and express sights may be used.

The Glock Pistol Match Course of Fire

- a) All firing is done on the NRA D-1 target.

Competitors must complete the entire course of fire before leaving the firing line.

- b) The Glock Pistol Match National Challenge course of fire is shown in Table 11

c) Each stage in the Glock Match course of fire consists of ten (10) shots. Competitors must place 10 rounds in a magazine, load on command and when targets turn to face competitors, fire the 10 rounds in a uniform time limit of 15 seconds.
