Rules: Current CMP rules will govern.

Eligibility: In accordance with CMP rule 2.0

All CMP-sponsored or CMP-sanctioned matches are open to any individual or team that complies with these eligibility requirements. U. S. citizenship is not required to participate. Individual membership in the CMP or a sponsoring organization is not required to participate. No person who has been convicted of a Federal or State felony or any violation of Section 922 of Title 18, U. S. Code, is eligible to participate in any activity sponsored or sanctioned by the CMP.

CMP Eligibility Affidavit Required Before an individual is permitted to participate in any CMP-sponsored or CMP sanctioned competition, the sponsoring club or the CMP Competitions Department shall have on file an affidavit from that individual certifying that he/she:

- a) Has not been convicted of any Federal or State felony or violation of Section 922 of Title 18 United States Code, and
- b) Is not a member of any organization that advocates the violent overthrow of the United States Government.

Rule 9.2.1 and 9.2.2 apply for non-distinguished military and civilian competitors, respectively

Open Individual Category: Competitors may compete "OIC" per Rule 2.10

Pre-Registration: For base personnel safety, JBER Public Affairs requires ALL competitors to have a DoD ID, or to be added to the list of planned participants at the beginning of the , or to contact the match director 2 weeks prior to the event to be background checked and added to list of cleared participants. Additionally, participants are required to pre-register beginning 2 weeks prior to the match, utilizing the link on the club's website. www.akrifleclub.com . Walk-on participants cannot be accommodated if they have not met the Public Affairs requirements.

Registration Capacity and Fees:

Maximum competitors: 24

Match Fee: ARC members \$15, non members \$20

Entries Due: 16:45-18:00, at the Pedneau 200 yd line, day of match.

Please Note: **Schedules require that no late entries can be accepted.**

Start Times: Firing commences at 18:15

Squadding: All matches will be squadded. Squadding assignment for individual matches will be issued during registration. **CMP Membership numbers and classification cards, if competitor has them, must be exhibited before squadding tickets are issued.** A competitor who fails to present himself at the proper firing point when his relay is called may lose his right to compete in that event.

Rifles: CMP Service Rifle-Rule 4.1.1, 4.1.3, 4.1.4
CMP Match Rifle-Rule 4.1.5.

Optical Sights: The rifle may have an optical sight (reflective sights are considered optical sights) with a maximum power of 4.5X. Variable scopes with a maximum of 4.5X are permitted. Only commercially manufactured scopes that were produced with a maximum magnification of 4.5X and that have a maximum objective lens of 34mm may be used. If an optical sight is used, the same optical sight must be used in all stages of a course of fire (changing sights is not permitted). The centerline of an optical sight shall be no higher than 3.5 inches above the centerline of the bore.

Metallic sights: The rifle may be equipped with issue-type metallic front and rear sights. The front and rear sights must be standard issue or National Match design but may vary in dimensions or rear sight aperture and front sight blade. The rear sight aperture may be hooded.

Ammunition: Competitors may use any ammunition that is safe to shoot. Remember safety is the responsibility of everyone. None of us wish to endanger ourselves or other competitors on the line.

Targets: Shotmarker will be used to electronically score targets.

Non-EIC Course of Fire:

10 shots in 10 minutes, standing, slow fire, 200 yards, SR target
10 shots in 63 seconds, **sitting or kneeling**, rapid fire, 200 yards, SR target
10 shots in 73 seconds, **prone**, rapid fire, 300 yards, SR-3 target
20 shots in 20 minutes, prone, slow fire, 600 yards, MR-1 target

Note 1: Two minutes will be allowed for 2 sighting shots at each stage.

Note 2: No alibis will be allowed for rifle/ammunition malfunction. Bring extra ammunition in the event that we have a range alibi.

Awards: There will be no awards.
