

CMP EIC Highpower Rifle Match

Dates: July 22, 2022 (backup date July 29, 2022)

Location: Pedneau Range, Ft. Richardson, Alaska

Sponsor: Alaska Rifle Club

Directions: Traveling North from Anchorage exit the Glenn Highway at JBER-Richardson exit, turn right at top of ramp, immediately turn left at gate onto Frontage Road, go 2 miles and turn right onto the gravel road at the Small Arms Range Complex sign, turn right at Y and follow the signs to Pedneau Range (first range on left).

Rules: Current [CMP Highpower Rifle Competition Rules](#) will govern.

Eligibility: In accordance with CMP rule 2.0

All CMP-sponsored or CMP-sanctioned matches are open to any individual or team that complies with these eligibility requirements. U. S. citizenship is not required to participate. Individual membership in the CMP or a sponsoring organization is not required to participate. No person who has been convicted of a Federal or State felony or any violation of Section 922 of Title 18, U. S. Code, is eligible to participate in any activity sponsored or sanctioned by the CMP.

CMP Eligibility Affidavit Required Before an individual is permitted to participate in any CMP-sponsored or CMP sanctioned competition, the sponsoring club or the CMP Competitions Department shall have on file a notarized affidavit from that individual certifying that he/she:

a) Has not been convicted of any Federal or State felony or violation of Section 922 of Title 18 United States Code, and

b) Is not a member of any organization that advocates the violent overthrow of the United States Government.

Rule 9.2.1 and 9.2.2 apply for non-distinguished military and civilian competitors, respectively

Open Individual Category: Competitors may compete "OIC" per Rule 2.10, but will not be eligible for awards or EIC points.

Pre-Registration: ALL competitors are required to pre-register beginning 2 weeks prior to the match, utilizing the club's website: <https://akrifleclub.com/schedule/> Walk-on participants may register on a space available, first come, first served basis.

Fees: Tournament Fee - \$25 (\$15 goes to CMP). Non-ARC members pay \$30.

Capacity: Maximum competitors: 24

Entries Due: EIC Match: **1700-1730**, day of match, Pedneau Range.
Please Note: **Schedules require that no late entries can be accepted.**

Start Times: Firing commences:
E.I.C. Leg Match: **1730** day of match

Squadding: All matches will be squadded. Squadding assignment for individual matches will be issued during registration. **CMP Membership numbers and classification cards, if competitor has them, must be exhibited before squadding tickets are issued.** A competitor who fails

to present himself at the proper firing point when his relay is called may lose his right to compete in that event.

Rifles: CMP Service Rifle-Rule 4.1.1, 4.1.3, 4.1.4 or Alternative Rifle 4.1.2.
CMP Match Rifle-Rule 4.1.5 may be fired but as Open Individual Category Rule 2.10 and will not be eligible for awards or to earn EIC credit points

Optical Sights: The Service Rifle may have an optical sight (reflective sights are considered optical sights) with a maximum power of 4.5X. Variable scopes with a maximum of 4.5X are permitted. Only commercially manufactured scopes that were produced with a maximum magnification of 4.5X and that have a maximum objective lens of 34mm may be used. If an optical sight is used, the same optical sight must be used in all stages of a course of fire (changing sights is not permitted). The centerline of an optical sight shall be no higher than 3.5 inches above the centerline of the bore.

Metallic sights: The Service Rifle may be equipped with issue-type metallic front and rear sights. The front and rear sights must be standard issue or National Match design but may vary in dimensions or rear sight aperture and front sight blade. The rear sight aperture may be hooded.

Ammunition: Competitors may use any ammunition that is safe to shoot. Remember safety is the responsibility of everyone. None of us wish to endanger ourselves or other competitors on the line.

Remanufactured 5.56 mm match ammunition may be purchased from the Alaska Rifle Club.

Scoring: Shotmarker will be used to electronically score targets.

EIC Course of Fire:

10 shots in 10 minutes, standing, slow fire, 200 yards, SR target

10 shots in 63 seconds, **sitting or kneeling from standing**, rapid fire, 200 yards, SR target

10 shots in 73 seconds, **prone from standing**, rapid fire, 300 yards, SR-3 target

20 shots in 20 minutes, prone, slow fire, 600 yards, MR-1 target

Note 1: No sighting shots are allowed at any position or distance.

Note 2: Competitor may fire from position for rapid fires, but their score will not count toward Distinguished. The score card will be verified if a competitor started from standing, or not, and any who fire from position may not fire until after the first standing competitor fires.

Awards: EIC points will be earned and awarded in accordance with CMP rules 9.2.

Note: An aggregate minimum score of 91% is required to earn EIC points.
