

Modern and Vintage High Power Rifle BRSP 200yd with Electronic Scoring

- Summary:** This is a FUN (no awards or classifications) 50 rounds plus sighters 4 stage high power rifle match fired at 200yards using Shotmarker electronic targets for scoring. Modern rifles, service rifles, vintage rifles, hunting or match rifles welcome. As long as the rifle is safe and ammunition is traveling a minimum of 1200fps at 200yards, that will ensure the Shotmarker sensor microphones can hear the shot properly to locate it on target. - Location:** Birchwood Recreation and Shooting Park

- Rules:** [Current NRA High Power rules](#) will govern. Open Bolt Indicator, Hearing and Eye Protection are required!
- Eligibility:** Open to all. Non-BRSP members pay an extra \$5 registration fee.
- Capacity:** Maximum competitors: 24
- Fees:** Tournament Fee: \$20 for BRSP members, \$25 for non-BRSP members.
- Entries Due:** Range opens 18:00. Entries close and safety briefing starts at 18:30.
- Online registration at brspclub.clubautomation.com preferred.** Walk on competitors will be squadded in a first come first served basis by signing up at the BRSP clubhouse.
- Start Times:** Shooting will start at 18:45
- Squadding:** Squadding assignment will be issued at the range after signing in at clubhouse.
- Classification**The NRA classification system will be used for informational purposes only.
- Rifles:** NRA Service Rifle-Rule 3.1 – see clarifications below on sights
Any Rifle-Rule 3.2 or NRA Match Rifle-Rule 3.3 - may have any type of sights, metallic or telescopic.
- The Service Rifle may have an optical sight (reflective sights are considered optical sights) with a maximum power of 4.5X and a maximum objective lens of 34mm. The Service Rifle may be equipped with issue-type metallic front and rear sights. The front and rear sights must be standard issue or National Match design but may vary in dimensions or rear sight aperture and front sight blade. The rear sight aperture may be hooded.
- Ammunition:** Competitors may use any ammunition that is safe to shoot. Remember safety is the responsibility of everyone. None of us wish to endanger ourselves or other competitors on the line.
Remanufactured 5.56 mm match ammunition may be purchased from the Alaska Rifle Club.

Scoring: Shotmarker will be used to electronically score targets. Ammunition must be supersonic (minimum of 1200fps at 200yards) to ensure the Shotmarker sensor microphones can hear the shot properly to locate it on target.

Sighters: Sighting shots (Rule 9.2), which are allowed in the conditions for each match may be taken and recorded. Sighting shots may be taken in a position other than specified for the match, but must be one of those described in Rule 5 of the High Power Rifle Rule Book, except 5.13.

Course of Fire

Match 1: 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record, standing, slow fire, 200 yards, SR target.

Match 2: 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record in 60 sec, sitting or kneeling, 200 yards, SR target.

Match 3: 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record, prone in 70 sec, 200 yards, SR-42 target.

Match 4: 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone, slow fire, 200 yards, MR-52 target.

Match 5: The slow fire aggregate: an aggregate of scores fired in matches 1 and 4

Match 6: The rapid-fire aggregate: an aggregate of scores fired in matches 2 and 3

Match 7: Aggregate of scores from matches 1-4

Classes: In fired match will be the same as aggregate matches.

Awards: No awards but results for the match will be posted on the club website, grouped by Rifle category: Service Rifle, Vintage Rifle, Hunting Rifle, Any Rifle, Match Rifle
