

2021 Alaska Rifle Club Highpower 80 Round NRA Match

- Capacity:** Maximum competitors: 28
- Dates:** Saturday June 19
- Location:** Pedneau Range, Joint Base Elmendorf Richardson, Alaska
- Sponsor:** Alaska Rifle Club
- Directions:** Traveling North from Anchorage exit the Glenn Highway at JBER-Richardson exit, turn right at top of ramp, immediately turn left at gate onto Frontage Road, go 2 miles and turn right onto the gravel road at the Small Arms Range Complex sign, turn right at Y and follow the signs to Pedneau Range (first range on left).

- Rules:** Current NRA High Power rules will govern. Open Bolt Indicator, Hearing and Eye Protection are required!
- Eligibility:** Open to any ARC member. Non-ARC members must pay \$5 one-day membership fee.
- Pre-Register:** ALL competitors are required to pre-register beginning 2 weeks prior to the match, utilizing the link on the clubs' website. www.akrifleclub.com. Walk-on participants may register on a space available, first come, first served basis.
- Fees:** Tournament Fee - \$20. (Includes NRA fee of \$4.50. Shooters under 18 are free).
- Entries Due:** 08:00 AM -08:30 AM. Competitor will need to supply their NRA number (if known) and mailing address.
- Start Times:** Firing commences 09:00 AM
- Squadding:** Squadding assignment for individual matches will be issued during registration.
- Classification** The NRA classification system will be used in. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class. Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6), or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2), may be used when making an entry in an NRA Tournament.
- Targets:** 200 yards (SR target), 300 yards (SR-3 target), and 600 yards (MR-1 target). Shotmarker electronic target systems will be used (Rule 10.17). Club provides tablets for shooters and scorers. In the event of a failure of the target systems, pulling targets in the pits will be required.
- Sighters:** Sighting shots (Rule 9.2.a.), which are allowed in the conditions for each match may be taken and recorded. Sighting shots may be taken in a position other than specified for the match but must be one of those described in Rule 5 of the High Power Rifle Rule Book, except 5.13.
- Rifles:** NRA Service Rifle-Rule 3.1, (a) (b) (c) & (d).
- Optical Sights:** The rifle may have an optical sight (reflective sights are considered optical sights) with a maximum power of 4.5X. Variable scopes with a maximum of 4.5X are permitted. Only commercially manufactured scopes that were produced with a maximum magnification of 4.5X and that have a maximum objective lens of 34mm may be used. If an optical sight is used, the same optical sight must be used in all stages of a course of fire (changing sights is not permitted). The centerline of an optical sight shall be no higher than 3.5 inches above the centerline of the bore.
- Metallic sights:** The rifle may be equipped with issue-type metallic front and rear sights. The front and rear sights must be standard issue or National Match design but may vary in dimensions or rear sight aperture and front sight blade. The rear sight aperture may be hooded.
- NRA Match Rifle-Rule 3.3
- Match 1:** 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, standing, slow fire, 200 yards, SR target. (Rule 5.12)
- Match 2:** 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, sitting or kneeling, rapid fire, 200 yards, SR target. (Rule 5.8 or 5.10)
- Match 3:** 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone, rapid fire, 300 yards, SR-3 target. (Rule 5.6)
- Match 4:** 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone, slow fire, 600 yards, MR-1 target. (Rule 5.6)
- Match 5:** The slow fire aggregate: an aggregate of scores fired in matches 1 and 4
- Match 6:** The rapid-fire aggregate: an aggregate of scores fired in matches 2 and 3
- Match 7:** The match grand aggregate: an aggregate of scores from matches 1-4
- Classes:** In fired match will be the same as aggregate matches.

Awards: There must be 5 or more entries in a rifle type or shooter classification for one award, 8 or more for two awards; and 13 or more for three awards. Awards applied towards next year club membership dues, then any extra mailed in a check at end of season.

Open Awards: Overall winners in Match 5 and 6: 1st = \$6, 2nd = \$4, 3rd = \$2. Match 7 Grand Aggregate: 1st = \$12, 2nd = \$10, 3rd = \$8.

Class Awards: Overall winners in Match 5 and 6: 1st = \$3, 2nd = \$2, 3rd = \$1. Match 7 Grand Aggregate: 1st = \$6, 2nd = \$4, 3rd = \$2. Winners of Open Awards may not win a class award. High Scoring Competitor in each class will be awarded for Match A as follows: If there are fewer than 5 High Masters entered in a category, they must fire for open awards only. The High Master Class may not be combined with the Master Class. If there are fewer than the required number of entries in a class to provide awards, they will be combined with the next higher class in the same category. If there are still fewer than 5 entries after combining all Marksman through Master categories of a class, there will be no class awards provided in that category.
