Rules: Current NRA High Power rules will govern. Open Bolt Indicator, Hearing and Eye Protection are

required!

Eligibility: Open to all in accordance with NRA rule 2. Non-BRSP members pay an extra \$5 registration fee.

Pre registration: Please register at https://brspclub.clubautomation.com/. Walk on competitors will be squadded

in a first come first served basis after signing up at the BRSP clubhouse.

Fees: Tournament Fee: \$20 for BRSP members, \$25 for non-BRSP members.

Entries Due: Range opens 17:30. Entries close and safety briefing starts at 17:30. If you can arrive at 16:30 to

help with range setup that would be much appreciated!

Start Times: Shooting will start at 18:00

Squadding: Squadding assignment will be issued at the range after signing in at clubhouse.

Classification: The NRA classification system will be used. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master

Class. Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6), or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2), may be used.

Scores shot in this League match will be submitted to the NRA at the end of the season

Rifles: NRA Service Rifle-Rule 3.1 – may have an optical sight (reflective sights are considered optical

sights) with a maximum power of 4.5X and a maximum objective lens of 34mm. The Service Rifle

may be equipped with issue-type metallic front and rear sights.

Any Rifle-Rule 3.2 or NRA Match Rifle-Rule 3.3 - may have any type of sights, metallic or

telescopic.

Ammunition: Competitors may use any ammunition that is safe to shoot. Remember safety is the

responsibility of everyone. None of us wish to endanger ourselves or other competitors on the

line.

Scoring: Shotmarker will be used to electronically score targets. Ammunition must be supersonic

(minimum of 1200fps at 200yards) to ensure the Shotmarker sensor microphones can hear the

shot properly to locate it on target.

Sighters: Sighting shots (Rule 9.2), which are allowed in the conditions for each match may be taken and

recorded. Sighting shots may be taken in a position other than specified for the match, but must

be one of those described in Rule 5 of the High Power Rifle Rule Book, except 5.13.

Course of Fire

Match 1: 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record, standing, slow fire, 200 yards, SR target. Match 2: 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record in 60 sec, sitting or kneeling, 200 yards, SR target.

Match 3: 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record, prone in 70 sec, 200 yards, SR-42 target.

Match 4: 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone, slow fire, 200 yards, MR-52 target.

Aggregate: Aggregate of scores from matches 1-4

Awards: No cash awards but results for the match will be posted on the club website, grouped by Rifle

category.
