

# 2026 Alaska Rifle Club CMP JBER Long Range Match

- Capacity:** Maximum competitors: 24
- Dates:** Monday June 29, 2026 (Evening)
- Location:** Grezelka Range, Joint Base Elmendorf Richardson, Alaska
- Directions:** Traveling North from Anchorage exit the Glenn Highway at JBER-Richardson exit, turn right at top of ramp, immediately turn left at gate onto Frontage Road. Traveling South from the valley exit the Glenn Highway at the JBER-Fort Richardson Arctic Valley exit. Turn left then 2<sup>nd</sup> left at the gate onto the Frontage Road. Traveling North on the Frontage Road, you will pass Range Control around 2.7 miles. Continue driving another 0.3 miles to the end of the road to Grezelka Range. Park away from the tower buildings and military vehicles. Look for a table in the parking lot to sign in.

- Rules:** This is a CMP sanctioned match. Current CMP High Power Rifle Competition will govern. Open Bolt Indicator, Hearing and Eye Protection are required (Rule 2.0) It is the competitors responsibility to know current rules governing this match in the CMP high-power rule book.
- Eligibility:** Open to any ARC member. Non-ARC members must pay \$5 one-day membership fee.
- Pre-Register:** For base personnel safety, JBER Public Affairs requires ALL competitors to have a DoD ID, or to be added to the list of planned participants at the beginning of the season, or contact the match director two weeks prior to the event to be background checked and added to list of cleared participants. Additionally, participants are required to pre-register beginning 2 weeks prior to the match, utilizing the link on the clubs' website <https://akrifleclub.com/schedule/>. Walk-on participants cannot be accommodated if they have not met the Public Affairs requirements.
- Fees:** Tournament Fee - \$20. Non-ARC members pay \$25. (Shooters under 18 are free).
- Entries Due:** 5:00 PM – 5:30 PM. Sign in at the Grezelka Range parking lot.
- Start Times:** Firing commences. 6:00PM
- Squadding:** Squadding assignment for matches will be issued during registration.
- Classification:** The CMP Long Range Rifle classification system will be used (Rule 4.10.7). Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class (Rule 4.10.9), Competitors who do not have a CMP Classification, but who have an NRA classification, may elect to compete with their current NRA classification (Rule 4.10.8).
- Targets:** 1000-yard LR (Prone) and LR-FC (F-Class) targets. Shot marker electronic target systems will be used (Rule 10.17). Club provides tablets for shooters and scorers or participants may use their own devices. Ammunition must remain supersonic (minimum of 1200fps residual velocity at 1000yards) to ensure the Shot marker sensor microphones can hear the shot properly to locate it on target.
- Rifles:** Service rifle (Rule 5.1.1, 5.1.2, 5.1.3, 5.1.4) Long Range Service Rifle (Rule 5.1.6) Match Rifle (Rule 5.1.5) Palma Rifle (Rule 6.9).

F-Class: F-Class Target Rifle (F-TR) (Rule 5.1.7), F-Class Open Rifle (F-O) (Rule 5.1.8)  
AR Tactical Rifle (Rule 5.1.9) **F-Class Practical Rifle (F-P) (Rule 5.1.10) (New class 2026)**

**Course of Fire: Match 1: 2 convertible sighters and 15 shots for record at 1000 yards, pair fired.**

**Match 2: 2 convertible sighters and 15 shots for record at 1000 yards, pair fired.**

**Match 3: 2 convertible sighters and 15 shots for record at 1000 yards, pair fired.**

**Sighters:** 2 convertible sighters will be allowed for each match, and shooters must either verbally take no-sighters for record, both sighters for record, and the second sighter for record. Shooters cannot pick the first sighter for record and discard the second sighter for record.

**Pair Fire:** Pair firing will be used - two competitors on the firing point. Competitor A is on the right and Competitor B is on the left. Competitors have 45 seconds to fire a shot after the previous competitor has shot. After competitor A fires a shot, competitor B verbally scores the shot. Competitor A must verbally acknowledge the score before competitor B fires. Competitor B then fires a shot within 45 seconds. Competitor A then verbally scores for Competitor B. Competitor B must verbally acknowledge the score before competitor A fires again. This alternating will continue until each competitor has completed the required number of shots in that string or match. If one competitor cannot be paired, they may not fire faster than a paired competitor adjacent to their firing point.

**Note:** F-Class shooters will fire the same course as the Prone Long-Range shooters, only they will use the F-Class targets and will fire either F-TR, F-Open or F- Class Practical Rifle (F-P) with a Long-Range classification against other F-Class shooters only, and Rule 22 - F-CLASS RIFLE RULES will apply for them.

**Awards:** No awards, but results for the match will be posted on the club website, grouped by Rifles: Prone and F-Open, F-TR, F-Class Practical Rifle (F-P)
