Capacity: Maximum competitors: 24

Dates: Monday June 30, 2025 (Evening)

Location: Grezelka Range, Joint Base Elmendorf Richardson, Alaska

Directions: Traveling North from Anchorage exit the Glenn Highway at JBER-Richardson exit, turn right at top of

ramp, immediately turn left at gate onto Frontage Road. Traveling South from the valley exit the Glenn Highway at the JBER-Fort Richardson Arctic Valley exit. Turn left then 2nd left at the gate onto the Frontage Road. Traveling North on the Frontage Road, you will pass Range Control around 2.7 miles. Continue driving another 0.3 miles to the end of the road to Grezelka Range. Park away from

the tower buildings and military vehicles. Look for a table in the parking lot for sign in.

Rules: Current NRA High Power rules and NRA F-Class Rules will govern. Open Bolt Indicator, Hearing and

Eye Protection are required!

Eligibility: Open to any ARC member. Non-ARC members must pay \$5 one-day membership fee.

Pre-Register: For base personnel safety, JBER Public Affairs requires ALL competitors to have a DoD ID, or to be

added to the list of planned participants at the beginning of the season, or contact the match director two weeks prior to the event to be background checked and added to list of cleared participants. Additionally, participants are required to pre-register beginning 2 weeks prior to the match, utilizing the link on the clubs' website https://akrifleclub.com/schedule/. Walk-on participants cannot be

accommodated if they have not met the Public Affairs requirements.

Fees: Tournament Fee - \$20. Non-ARC members pay \$25. (Shooters under 18 are free).

Entries Due: 5:00 PM – 5:30 PM. Sign in at the Grezelka Range parking lot.

Start Times: Firing commences. 6:00PM

Squadding: Squadding assignment for matches will be issued during registration.

Classification: The NRA LR classification system will be used. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master

Class. Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6), or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2), may be used. Scores shot in this League match will be submitted to the NRA at the end of the season.

Targets: 1000 yard LR (Prone) and LR-FC (F-Class) targets. Shotmarker electronic target systems will be

used (Rule 10.17). Club provides tablets for shooters and scorers or participants may use their own devices. Ammunition must remain supersonic (minimum of 1200fps residual velocity at 1000yards) to

ensure the Shotmarker sensor microphones can hear the shot properly to locate it on target.

Rifles: Prone: Service Rifle (Rule 3.1), Any Rifle (Rule 3.2), NRA Match Rifle (Rule 3.3) Palma Rifle (Rule

3.3.1).

F-Class: F-Class Open Rifle (F-O) (Rule 3.4(a)), F-Class Target Rifle (F-TR) (Rule 3.4(b)).

F-Club: Rifles using muzzle brakes or suppressors or otherwise not compliant with NRA F-Class rifle

rule. Scores not submitted to NRA but still eligible for awards if fired from prone position.

Course of Fire:

Sighters: There will be a 2 minute blowoff period at the beginning of each relay. 2 convertible sighters will be

allowed for each match, and shooters must either verbally take no sighters for record, both sighters for record, or the second sighter for record. Shooters can not pick the first sighter for record and

discard the second sighter for record.

Pair Fire: Pair firing will be used - two competitors on the firing point. Competitor A is on the right and

Competitor B is on the left. Competitors have 45 seconds to fire a shot after the previous competitor has shot. After competitor A fires a shot, competitor B verbally scores the shot. Competitor A must verbally acknowledge the score before competitor B fires. Competitor B then fires a shot within 45 seconds. Competitor A then verbally scores for Competitor B. Competitor B must verbally

seconds. Competitor A then verbally scores for Competitor B. Competitor B must verbally acknowledge the score before competitor A fires again. This alternating will continue until each

competitor has completed the required number of shots in that string or match. If one any competitor cannot be paired, they may not fire faster than a paired competitor adjacent to their firing point.

Match A: two convertible sighting shots and 20 shots for record prone pair fire at 1000 yards. **Match B:** two convertible sighting shots and 20 shots for record prone pair fire at 1000 yards.

Match C: Will consist of an aggregate of the two matches above.

Note: F-Class shooters will fire the same course as the Prone Long-Range shooters, only they will use the

F-Class targets and will fire either F-TR, F-Open or F-Club with a Long-Range classification against

other F-Class shooters only, and Rule 22 - F-CLASS RIFLE RULES will apply for them.

Awards: No awards, but results for the match will be posted on the club website, grouped by Rifles: Prone

and F-Open, F-TR, F-Club.
