

## 2023 NRA League High Power Rifle Full Distance Matches

**Dates:** May 5, June 16, August 18, 2023

**Location:** Pedneau Range, Ft. Richardson, Alaska

**Sponsor:** Alaska Rifle Club

**Directions:** Traveling North from Anchorage exit the Glenn Highway at JBER-Richardson exit, turn right at top of ramp, immediately turn left at gate onto Frontage Road. Traveling South from the valley exit the Glenn Highway at the JBER-Fort Richardson Arctic Valley exit. Turn left then 2nd left at the gate onto the Frontage Road. Traveling North on the Frontage Road, go 2 miles and turn right onto the gravel road at the Small Arms Range Complex sign, turn right at Y and follow the signs to Pedneau Range (first range on left).

**Rules:** [Current NRA High Power rules](#) will govern. Open Bolt Indicator, Hearing and Eye Protection are required!

**Eligibility:** In accordance with NRA rule 2, all NRA-sponsored or NRA-sanctioned matches are open to any individual or team that complies with these eligibility requirements. U. S. citizenship is not required to participate. Individual membership in the NRA or a sponsoring organization is not required to participate.

**Pre-Registration:** ALL competitors are required to pre-register beginning 2 weeks prior to the match, utilizing the link on the clubs' website. <https://akrifleclub.com/schedule/> Walk-on participants may register on a space available, first come, first served basis.

**Fees:** Tournament Fee - \$20. Non-ARC members pay \$25. (Shooters under 18 are free).

**Capacity:** Maximum competitors: 24

**Entries Due:** High Power Match: **1620-1700**, day of match, Pedneau Range.  
Please Note: **Schedules require that no late entries can be accepted.**

**Start Times:** Firing commences:  
High Power Match: **1730** day of match

**Squadding:** All matches will be squadded. Squadding assignment for individual matches will be issued during registration. NRA Membership numbers and classification cards, if competitor has them, must be exhibited before squadding tickets are issued. A competitor who fails to present himself at the proper firing point when his relay is called may lose his right to compete in that event.

**Classification** The NRA classification system will be used. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class. Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6), or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2), may be used.  
**Scores shot in this League match will be submitted to the NRA at the end of the season.**

**Rifles:** NRA Service Rifle-Rule 3.1 – see clarifications below on sights  
Any Rifle-Rule 3.2 or NRA Match Rifle-Rule 3.3 - may have any type of sights, metallic or telescopic.

**Optical Sights:** The Service Rifle may have an optical sight (reflective sights are considered optical sights) with a maximum power of 4.5X. Variable scopes with a maximum of 4.5X are permitted. Only commercially manufactured scopes that were produced with a maximum magnification of 4.5X and that have a maximum objective lens of 34mm may be used. If an optical sight is used, the same optical sight must be used in all stages of a course of fire (changing sights is not permitted). The centerline of an optical sight shall be no higher than 3.5 inches above the centerline of the bore.

**Metallic sights:** The Service Rifle may be equipped with issue-type metallic front and rear sights. The front and rear sights must be standard issue or National Match design but may vary in dimensions or rear sight aperture and front sight blade. The rear sight aperture may be hooded.

**Ammunition:** Competitors may use any ammunition that is safe to shoot. Remember safety is the responsibility of everyone. None of us wish to endanger ourselves or other competitors on the line. Remanufactured 5.56 mm match ammunition may be purchased from the Alaska Rifle Club.

**Scoring:** Shotmarker will be used to electronically score targets.

**Sighters:** Sighting shots (Rule 9.2), which are allowed in the conditions for each match may be taken and recorded. Sighting shots may be taken in a position other than specified for the match, but must be one of those described in Rule 5 of the High Power Rifle Rule Book, except 5.13.

## **Courses of Fire**

**Match 1:** 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record, standing, slow fire, 200 yards, SR target.

**Match 2:** 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record in 60 sec, sitting or kneeling, 200 yards, SR target.

**Match 3:** 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record, prone in 70 sec, 300 yards, SR-3 target.

**Match 4:** 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone, slow fire, 600 yards, MR-1 target.

**Match 5:** The slow fire aggregate: an aggregate of scores fired in matches 1 and 4

**Match 6:** The rapid-fire aggregate: an aggregate of scores fired in matches 2 and 3

**Match 7:** Aggregate of scores from matches 1-4

**Classes:** In fired match will be the same as aggregate matches.

**Awards:** There must be 5 or more entries in a rifle type or shooter classification for one award, 8 or more for two awards; and 13 or more for three awards. Awards applied towards next year Alaska Rifle Club membership dues, then any extra mailed in a check at end of season. Overall and class-based awards will be based on Matches 5, 6, and 7 with all Service Rifles in one group and all other (Any or Match) Rifles in another group.

**Open Awards:** Overall winners in Match 5 and 6: 1st = \$6, 2nd = \$4, 3rd = \$2. Match 7 Grand Aggregate: 1st = \$12, 2nd = \$10, 3rd = \$8.

**Class Awards:** Overall winners in Match 5 and 6: 1st = \$3, 2nd = \$2, 3rd = \$1. Match 7 Grand Aggregate: 1st = \$6, 2nd = \$4, 3rd = \$2. Winners of Open Awards may not win a class award. High Scoring Competitor in each class will be awarded for Match A as follows: If there are fewer than 5 High Masters entered in a category, they must fire for open awards only. The High Master Class may not be combined with the Master Class. If there are fewer than the required number of entries in a class to provide awards, they will be combined with the next higher class in the same category. If there are still fewer than 5 entries after combining all Marksman through Master categories of a class, there will be no class awards provided in that category.
